Technical Information

1. Dates

(AYG) competition for the 3rd Asian Youth Games 2025 will be held from 22 to 31 October 2025. U17 Boy Futsal competition will be held from 24 to 30 October 2025 and U17 Girl Futsal competition will be held from 23 to 29 October 2025.

2. Venues

Futsal competition will be held in Manama, Bahrain. Boys and Girls U17 Futsal competition will be held at Khalifa Sport City Hall.

3. Events

Futsal competition will consist of two (2) events including U17 Boys Team and U17 Girls Team.

5. **Sport Entries**

5.1. Eligibility

- Only NOCs that are members of the OCA are eligible to send athletes to compete in the Futsal competition of the 3rd Asian Youth Games.
- Only athletes who comply with the OCA Constitution and Rules and its Bye-law are entitled to compete in the Futsal competition.

5.2. Entry Timeline

- Entry by Sport: Deadline: 24:00 25 March, 2025 (Manama Time, GMT +3)
- Entry by Number: from 10:00 30 June 2025 to 23:59 21 July 2025 (Bahrain Time, UTC +3).
- Entry by Name: from 10:00 1 August 2025 to 23:59 31 August 2025 (Bahrain Time, UTC +3).

5.3. Entry Policies

- Team Events: Each NOC may only enter one (1) U17 Boys team and one (1) U17 Girls team in Futsal.
- Total: Each NOC may enter a maximum of fourteen (14) Boy and fourteen (14) Girl athletes in Futsal.
- The total of participating teams is not more than 9 Boy teams, and 6 Girl teams

- Any NOC that withdraws its athletes or teams after the submission of the final entries by name or the Team Draw phase will be faced with disciplinary action by the OCA Executive Board.

5.4. Age Limitation

- Athletes participating in the Futsal competition must be between 14 and 16 years old and must be born between 2009 and 2011.





6. Arrival and Departure

- Team's arrival is fixed two (2) days before the competition (i.e., 22 October 2025 for Boys futsal competition and 21 October 2025 for Girls futsal competition) and depart one (1) day after the team's last match in the competition.

7. Technical Officials

- The AFC shall appoint Technical Delegate(s), Match Commissioners, Referee Assessors, AFC Disciplinary and Ethics Committee Member(s), AFC Appeal Committee Member(s), Referees, Timekeepers, other officials and AFC staff may be approved by the OCA.
- Referees and Assistant Referees appointed by the AFC shall be from the official FIFA List of International Referees and Assistant Referees. AFC has the right to appoint Technical Delegate(s) and ITOs in coordination and approval of the OCA. In case of violation of the AFC/FIFA Rules and Games Rules and Regulations by any participants, the OCA has the right to revoke the AD Card and propose change of the person to the concerned party.

8. Pre Competition Meeting

8.1 Match Coordination Meeting

The Match Coordination Meeting for Boys futsal competition will be convened on 23 October 2025 for group stage at (Official Hotel), and for Girls futsal competition will be on 22 October 2025 at (Official Hotel).

8.2 Official Training

Each Team is entitled to a forty-five (45) minutes official training session that will be partially/fully open to the media (depending on the preference of the team) at the following venues:

U17 Boy: TBC

U17 Girl: TBC

We will be composing the training schedule depending on your arrival schedule to Bahrain, if any team fails to comply with their official training or fails to start on time, there shall be NO replacement or time extension for Official Training.

8.3 Media Interviews

Athletes and officials may take part in media interviews at various times throughout the Games. For athletes, this may take place in the mixed zone or at media conferences. Additional media interviews may take place, but these are generally arranged through the teams. All athletes must pass through the mixed zone but are not obligated to provide interviews.





9. Competition Rules

9.1 Competition Rules

The Futsal of the 3rd Asian Youth Games 2025 shall be conducted in accordance with the latest Futsal Laws of the Games authorised by The International Football Association Board (The IFAB) and promulgated and published by the Federation International de Football Association (FIFA) for the year the Games are held. In case of any disagreement in the interpretation of the regulations and rules, the English version shall prevail. Any unforeseen cases not covered by the Futsal Laws of the Game shall be resolved as follows:

General Issues: Resolved in accordance with the Olympic Council of Asia Constitution and Rules.

Technical Issues: Resolved by the Technical Committee appointed by the Asian Football Confederation (AFC).

Conduct of teams, players and officials on the Pitch: Resolved by the AFC Disciplinary and Ethics Committee.

9.2 Competition System

The competition format shall comprise of a preliminary group stage and a knockout stage.

U17 Boys group

The Group Winners and Best 2nd placed team, 4 teams in total will qualify for the knockout stage (semi-finals).

The following scenario shall apply, based on best 2nd placed team among the groups:

	Best 2 nd placed from Group A	Best 2 nd placed from Group B	Best 2 nd placed from Group C

The (2) winners of the semi-finals will advance to the final and the two losing teams will play in the bronze medal match.

U17 Girls group

The Group Winners and Runners-up from each group, 4 teams in total will qualify for the semi- finals, subsequently the winners of semi-finals will advance to the final and



the two losing teams will play in the bronze medal match.

The Official Match Ball:

The Official Match Ball (Futsal Ball) will be “Molten”. The Host will be providing all Participating Teams with ten (10) official match balls for their training. Ten (10) training balls will be provided in all training halls, and these balls must be returned after being used in training.

Equipment used by athletes and other relevant participants in the Futsal competition must comply with the AFC Equipment Regulations and any other relevant regulations and rules of the AFC/FIFA.

Only official match balls can be used during the tournament, no replacement will be provided or lost or damaged balls.



Pitch Surface:

The surface of the pitch must be flat and smooth, and be comprised of non-abrasive surfaces, preferably made of wood or artificial material, according to the competition rules.

9.3 Team Officials

Each Participating Team (Boy and Girl) shall register a minimum of three (3) and a maximum of ten (10) Participating Officials. A total of six (6) Participating Officials must be registered in the 'Participating Officials on the Substitution Bench' Form.





Final Players Registration

1. Each Participating Team shall submit a Final Registration of fourteen (14) Participating Players.
2. The Final Registration may only be composed of those Participating Players registered in the Preliminary Registration for the Competition.
3. Participating Players must be allocated a playing number between 1 and 14. Playing number 1 shall be reserved for a goalkeeper. Each Participating Player shall wear the same playing number allocated in the Final Registration during all Matches in the Competition.
4. Each Participating Team shall submit its Final Registration at the match coordination meeting for its first Match in the Competition.
5. Each Participating Team must register a minimum of two (2) goalkeepers in its Final Registration.
6. Once the Final Registration has been received by the OCA, Participating Teams may replace any of the registered Participating Players up to six (6) hours prior to their first Match.

9.4 Team Bench and Technical Area

A maximum of six (6) Participating Officials and a maximum of nine (9) Participating Players are permitted to sit on the team bench during a Match, provided they are in possession of the appropriate Accreditation Card. All individuals on the team bench must wear kit that contrasts with the kit of the Participating Players and Match Officials on the Pitch. The following three (3) Participating Officials must be registered on the "Officials on the Substitution Bench" form: Head Coach, Team Manager and Team Doctor or Physiotherapist.

9.5 Caution and Expulsions

Boys:

All matters related to cautions and/or expulsions, including the carrying forward of cautions between stages of the Competition, shall be undertaken in accordance with the AFC Disciplinary and Ethics Code. For the avoidance of any doubt, any individual who receives a caution in two (2) separate Matches shall be automatically suspended for the next Match in the Competition except where expressly set out below.

Any Participating Player or Participating Official who completes the Group Stage having received only one (1) caution shall carry-over that caution to the Quarter Finals.

Any Participating Player or Participating Official who completes the Group Stage and Quarter Finals having received only one (1) caution shall not carry-over that caution to the Semi Finals.

Any Participating Player or Participating Official who receives a red card or is sent off during the Competition shall automatically be suspended from the match following the match in which he or she received the red card or sent off. An official who has been sent off may give instructions to the person replacing him/her on the team bench. They shall ensure that they do not disturb spectators or disrupt the





flow of play after they are sent off. Any player or official who received a red card or who was sent off during the Competition shall remain suspended from further play until their case has been decided by the AFC Disciplinary and Ethics Committee.

A suspended player or official shall not be allowed on the team bench, the team dressing room, the technical area and shall not communicate with his or her team using electronic or any other means (e.g. hand signals) for the duration of a match.

Each Participating Team shall bear the responsibility of monitoring cautions and/or suspensions received by its player(s) and/or official(s) during the Competition and ensure that all player(s) and/or official(s) registered and/or fielded during the Competition are eligible to play.

Girls:

All matters related to cautions and/or expulsions, including the carrying forward of cautions between stages of the Competition, shall be undertaken in accordance with the AFC Disciplinary and Ethics Code. For the avoidance of any doubt, any individual who receives a caution in two (2) separate Matches shall be automatically suspended for the next Match in the Competition except where expressly set out below.

Any Participating Player or participating official who completes the Group Stage having received only one (1) caution shall not carry over that caution to the Semi Finals.

Any Participating Player or participating official who received a red card or is sent off during the Competition shall automatically be suspended from the match following the match in which he or she received the red card or sent off. An official who has been sent off may give instructions to the person replacing him/her on the team bench. They shall ensure that they do not disturb spectators or disrupt the flow of play after they are sent off. Any player or official who received a red card or who was sent off during the Competition shall remain suspended from further play until their case has been decided by the AFC Disciplinary and Ethics Committee.

A suspended player or official shall not be allowed on the team bench, the team dressing room, the technical area and shall not communicate with his or her team using electronic or any other means (e.g. hand signals) for the duration of a match.

Each Participating Team shall bear the responsibility of monitoring cautions and/or suspensions received by its player(s) and/or official(s) during the Competition and ensure that all player(s) and/or official(s) registered and/or fielded during the Competition are eligible to play.

10. Protest and Appeals

The provisions of this Article shall apply to protests which fall within the jurisdiction of the Jury of Appeal and the AFC Disciplinary and Ethics Committee.

Protests before the Jury of Appeal

Protests in relation to disputes of a technical nature concerning the Competition





shall be decided upon by the Jury of Appeal.

In addition, the protests in relation to all disputes of a non-technical nature outside the jurisdiction of the AFC Disciplinary and Ethics Committee shall fall under the jurisdiction of the Jury of Appeal. Any NOC dissatisfied with the decision of any Jury of Appeal may appeal in writing to the OCA EB which shall decide on the matter. All decisions of the OCA EB shall be final.

Except in exceptional circumstances, any protest in relation to matters to be decided by the Jury of Appeal must be made in writing within sixty (60) minutes of the decision giving rise to the claim or protest. The Jury of Appeal, after an investigation, shall then give a decision within two (2) hours of such protest.

If any of the formal requirements set out in these Regulations in respect of protests before the Jury of Appeal are not met, the relevant protest shall be disregarded. The AIMAGOC decides whether or not such formal requirements have been met. Such decisions are final and binding and not appealable.

Any NOCs dissatisfied with any decision by the Jury of Appeal may make an appeal by submitting the written appeal together with a fee of USD200 per protest payable to the AIMAGOC.

The protest fee shall be refunded if the protest is upheld; it will be forfeited if the protest is rejected.

Protests before the AFC Disciplinary and Ethics Committee

Protests in relation to matters involving the conduct of teams, players and officials on the Pitch will be dealt with by the AFC Disciplinary and Ethics Committee (a "Pitch Protest"). Appeals against decisions on protests made by the AFC Disciplinary and Ethics Committee shall be heard by the AFC Appeal Committee.

For the purposes of the Competition, a protest is an objection of any kind related to any event and/or matter that has a direct effect on a match.

To be considered valid, a Pitch Protest must be:

- a. Submitted in writing (using the appropriate Protest Form issued by the AFC) to the Match Commissioner for the relevant Match within two (2) hours of the final whistle, or, if the relevant Match was cancelled or abandoned, within two (2) hours of the decision to cancel or abandon the Match (the "**Protest Deadline**");
- b. Followed up with a full written report (including a copy of the original Protest Form) which must be sent to the AFC within twenty-four (24) hours of the Protest Deadline; and
- c. Accompanied by a fee of USD200 (non-inclusive of any bank charges) which must be transmitted to the BAYGOC within twenty-four (24) hours of the Protest Deadline.

No Pitch Protest shall be lodged relating to the Referee's decisions regarding facts connected with play. Such decisions are final and binding and not subject to appeal, unless otherwise stipulated in the AFC Disciplinary and Ethics Code. The same applies to any potential issue concerning the use and/or operation of any goal-line technology (GLT) and/or video support (VS) system.

If any of the formal requirements set out above are not met, the relevant protest shall be disregarded. The secretariat to the AFC Disciplinary and Ethics Committee decides whether or not such formal requirements have been met. Such decisions are final and binding and not appealable.

The AFC Disciplinary and Ethics Committee may transfer a protest to the Jury of





Appeal for its decision if it is deemed to be technical in nature or otherwise outside of the jurisdiction of the AFC Disciplinary and Ethics Committee.

11. General Rules and Regulations

11.1 Rules

11.1.1 Eligibility Code (OCA 52)

To be eligible for participation in the OCA Games, a competitor must:

- a) Observe and abide by the Rules of the IOC/OCA as per the Olympic Charter.
- b) Respect the spirit of fair play and non-violence and abide by the rules on the sports field.
- c) Comply with all aspects of WADA Code and OCA Anti-Doping Rules and refrain from using substances and drugs prohibited by the said organisations;
- d) The Member must ensure that any competitor in the OCA Games must be a national of the country of the NOC.
- e) Disputes relating to the determination of the country which a competitor may represent in the OCA Games shall be resolved by the EB, unless the eligibility code already set out in the Constitution has been fulfilled and is not in dispute.

11.1.2 Nationality of Competitor (OCA By-Law 52)

- a) All cases of infringement of IOC Rule 41, 42 and its By-Laws and of the eligibility code of IFs shall be communicated by the concerned Member to the OCA, to be considered by the EB whose decision will be final;
- b) A competitor who is a national of two (2) or more countries at the same time may represent either one (1) of them, as he may elect. However, after having represented one country in the Olympic, Asian continental regional or world championships recognised by the relevant IF, the competitor may not represent another country unless he or she meets the conditions set forth in sub section 4 below that apply to the persons who has changed his/her nationality or acquired a new nationality.
- c) A competitor who has represented one country in the Olympic Games, OCA Games, continental, regional, and world championships recognised by the relevant IF, and who has changed his/her nationality or acquired a new nationality, shall not participate in the OCA Games to represent his/her new country until three years after such change or acquisition;
- d) If a State, Country or a colony acquires independence, a country becomes incorporated within another country by a change of border or transfer of sovereignty or if a new NOC is recognised by the OCA, a competitor may continue to represent the country to which he/she belongs or belonged. However, he/she may, if preferred, choose to represent his/her country or be entered in the OCA Games by his/her new NOC if one exists. This option can only be made once and is irreversible.
- e) In all cases not expressly addressed in these By-Laws, in particular those cases where a competitor would be in a position to represent a country other than that of which he/she is a national, or to have choice as to the country which he/she intends to represent, the EB makes all decisions of individual nature and issue specific requirements relating to nationality,





citizenship, domicile or residence of the competitors, including the duration of any waiting period.

- f) Except as permitted by the EB, no competitor, coach or official who participates in the OCA Games may allow his/her person, name and picture or sports performances to be used for advertising purposes during the OCA Games.

11.1.3 Number of Entries (OCA 58)

- a) For a sport to be included in the OCA Games Programme a minimum of six (6) NOCs should enter their athletes by number and a minimum of four (4) should be physically present before the start of the competition.
- b) The maximum number of entries from each country in each sport or event is established by the Council in consultation with the Member hosting the Games:
- c) However, the following numbers cannot be exceeded:
 - For individual events, two competitors from each Member;
 - For team events, one team per Member.
 - For events where individual and team competitions are conducted simultaneously, and the team event is decided by the aggregate score/time of each individual member of the team, the athlete (if maximum two) participating in the individual event must be designated as such in the Entry form and only the athlete concerned will be competing in the individual event.

11.1.4 Technical Official and Jury of Appeal (OCA 59)

The BAYGOC must not receive or otherwise give official recognition to any foreign political delegation or leaders of any other mission whatsoever, without the prior written approval of the OCA. However, nobody can be discriminated against if he or she is a duly appointed official of the NOC's sports delegation.

11.1.5 Court of Appeal (OCA 79)

- a) The OCA EB is the final Court of Appeal, which will decide all disputes of a non-technical nature concerning the OCA Games. Teams/Member of the NOCs, if necessary, may submit disputes to the Court of Appeal. In addition, the Court of Appeal may intervene in all disputes of a non-technical nature outside the jurisdiction of the Juries of Appeal set up for each sport in the Programme;
- b) The Court of Arbitration for Sport (CAS) in association with the OCA will set up a small Ad Hoc working group that will be present and working alongside the OCA during the 3rd Asian Youth Games period only, as done during the Olympic Games. The participating athletes can address any issues that they may have directly with CAS, during the OCA Games.

11.1.6 Claims of Protest (OCA 80)

- a) Claims made to the Judges on grounds concerning matters of fact are decided by them without appeal.
- b) Appeals against other decisions of the Judges or with regard to any other matters must be addressed to the President of the Technical Jury of Appeal for the sport concerned by a representative of the team making the appeal.





- c) Except in exceptional circumstances, a claim must be made within two (2) hours of the decision giving rise to it. The Jury, after an investigation, shall give a decision and this decision shall be irrevocable, except in the case of disqualification of a team or of a competitor for infraction of the Rules and Regulations of the OCA. In this case it shall be decided by the Court of Appeal.
- d) All claims and appeals must be made in writing.

11.1.7 Penalties in Case of Fraud (OCA 81)

If this competitor's team is proved to have been a party to the fraud, his/her team shall be disqualified in the sport involved.

11.1.8 Disciplinary Measures and Appeals

Disciplinary measures and appeals shall be dealt with in compliance with the AFC Statutes, AFC Disciplinary & Ethics Code, any relevant AFC circular(s) and all other applicable AFC rules and regulations, as well as the applicable provisions of this Technical Handbook.

For the avoidance of any doubt (but without prejudice to any provisions of the AFC Statutes, AFC Disciplinary & Ethics Code and all other applicable AFC rules and regulations), the scope of activity of the AFC Disciplinary and Ethics Committee and AFC Appeal Committee members appointed pursuant to this Technical Handbook with regard to the competition shall be limited to disciplinary matters involving the conduct of teams, players and officials on the pitch.

11.1.9 Extra Time and Penalties

If no winner is determined at the end of normal playing time in any Match in the Knockout Stage, no Extra Time shall be played, and Penalties shall be taken in accordance with the Laws of the Game and the AFC Competition Operations Manual.

11.1.10 Calculation of best 2nd placed team can be referred to in Appendix 2 of the AFC Competition Operations Manual.

Appeals against decisions of the AFC Disciplinary and Ethics Committee shall be heard by the AFC Appeal Committee subject to the relevant provisions of the AFC Disciplinary and Ethics Code.

Certain decisions passed by the AFC Appeal Committee may be appealed before the Court of Arbitration for Sport (CAS) if such appeal is in accordance with the relevant articles of the AFC Statutes and the AFC Disciplinary and Ethics Code.

12. Equipment and Clothing

Clothing worn by athletes and other relevant participants in the Futsal competition must comply with the AFC Equipment Regulations and any other relevant regulation and rules of the AFC/FIFA.

Neither athletes nor technical officials can attach any form of commercial advertising to his/her competition uniform without prior agreement from OCA and BAYGOC.





13. Doping Control

In order to ensure healthy and fair competitions and protect the interests of the athletes, the anti-doping programme of the 3rd Asian Youth Games will be conducted in strict accordance with the World Anti-Doping Code and the OCA Anti-Doping Rules.

14. Victory Ceremony

The medal presentations shall in the following order:

- Gold Medal – to the first-place winner
- Silver Medal – to the second-place winner
- Bronze Medal – to the third-place winner

15. Approval of the Technical Handbook

The Technical Handbook has been approved by the Asian Football Confederation (AFC) On 31st August 2025.
