Türkiye General Information

With its breathtaking natural beauties, unique history and archaeological ruins, increasingly developing tourism infrastructure and tradition of hospitality, Türkiye is one of the countries that should be visited.

Türkiye, whose capital is Ankara, is located at a point where Europe, Asia and Africa – the so cold old continents of the northern hemisphere – become nearest. While one part of the land is on the Peninsula of Anatolia, the other stretches out to Thrace, which is an extension of the Balkan Peninsula. The three sides of the country are surrounded by the Mediterranean, the Black Sea, the Marmara and the Aegean, which connect these two seas with straits.

Its neighbours can be listed as Greece, Bulgaria, Georgia, Armenia, Azerbaijan, Iran, Iraq and Syria.

Türkiye is a member of various international organizations among which the United Nations, North Atlantic Treaty Organization, European Council, Organization of Islamic Cooperation, and Black Sea Economic Cooperation can be listed. As of October 3rd, 2005, negotiations on full membership in the European Union have started. According to political scientists and economists, Türkiye is a regional power. Today, the Turkish economy ranks among the first 20 biggest economies in the world. The target is to rank as the 10th in the 100th anniversary of the republic (in the year 2023).

Türkiye, officially known as the Republic of Türkiye, is both a European and an Asian country. Its neighbour to the northwest is Bulgaria; Greece to the west; Armenia, Azerbaijan and Iran to the east; Georgia to the northeast; Syria to the south; and Iraq to the southeast.

Climate

The coastal areas of Türkiye bordering the Aegean Sea and the Mediterranean Sea have a hot-summer Mediterranean climate, with hot, dry summers and mild to cool, wet winters. The coastal areas of Türkiye bordering the Black Sea have a temperate Oceanic climate with warm, wet summers and cool to cold, wet winters.

The National language is Turkish.

Shopping and Monetary Matters

The currency in Türkiye is the Turkish Lira (sign: 5; code: TL). The following TL banknotes and coins (Kuruş) are in circulation:

Banknotes with face values of 5, 10, 20, 50, 100, 200 TL

There are coins of 1 TL pieces as well as 5, 10, 25 and 50 Kuruş coins.

Türkiye has a very well-developed bank network. There are several banking groups. Most banks have the following opening hours:

Monday - Friday: 09:00 - 12:30 and 13:30 - 17:00

Outside these opening hours, you will find teller machines (ATMs) at most branches of Turkish banks. ATMs are widely used and accept most debit cards and international credit cards.

Credit cards are accepted in most hotels and large restaurants and stores, but they are less frequently used for purchases in small shops, cafes and grocery stores. Most shops are open between 9.00 and close at 22.00 hrs. Most shops hold to these shopping hours for the whole week.

Money in US Dollars and Euro currency can be changed at nearly every bank and change Office at the Airport and City Center.

Konya, with its deep-rooted history dating back to 7000 BC, is one of the oldest settlements in Anatolia.

Konya, home of many civilizations in history, was the capital of the Anatolian Selçuk Sultanate, the standard-bearer of Islam. Konya ranks as one of the great cultural centres of Türkiye with its historical artifacts, mosques, madrasah, caravanserai and shrines, which are the reflections of this rich historical context. In addition to the mystical atmosphere, Konya attracts nature lovers with its thermal springs, green areas and lakes.

The Mausoleum of Mevlânâ Celâleddîn-i Rûmî, located in Konya, also known as the Capital of Tolerance, Solidarity and Understanding, welcomes thousands of people from all around the world every year. While the Whirling Dervishes' sema (firmament) ceremonies and mystical music festivals provide a fascinating experience to the audience throughout the year, Konya is also a center of attraction for guests with its international sports activities, and exhibitions and symposiums.

When Konya is mentioned, its great cuisine and delicious local dishes come to mind. With its rich food culture, it is possible to find flavours that appeal to every palate in Konya.

Konya, chosen as the 'Islamic Capital of Tourism' in 2016 by the Organization of Islamic Cooperation, has accomplished many events and proved its capacity and ability to organize international sporting events or otherwise organizations.

Konya is also a city of universities and sports. As such, Konya is a candidate to host the Sports Capital of Islamic Countries (SCIC) Program in 2021 with the maxim of "Historical Center of Global Sports". Konya is one of the centers of Türkiye's economic life. With its strong economy and the wealth of the young population, Konya already benefits from the strategic urban development program, implemented in line with the comprehensive National Plan for Türkiye scheduled to be completed successfully by the Republic's 100th Anniversary in 2023.

Thanks to the significant efforts of Konya Metropolitan Municipality on air quality management and emission control measures, Konya enjoys great air quality exceeding the benchmarks. High-quality drinking water is available throughout the city and water quality falls well within WHO guidelines and standards.

The Islamic Solidarity Sports Federation FOUNDATION

The 3rd Islamic Summit held in Makkah and Ta'if (1981 – 1401AH) resolved to establish the Islamic Solidarity Sports Federation (I.S.S.F) to organize sports competitions among members of the Organization of Islamic Cooperation (OIC) and participate in sports-related events.

In 1985 (1405 AH), on an initiative of Saudi Arabia's General Presidency of Youth Welfare (GPYW), the National Olympic Committees of Islamic countries were invited to attend the foundation conference of the I.S.S.F. An Executive Committee was elected to run the I.S.S.F activities under the leadership of His Royal Highness the late Prince Faisal Fahd Abdulaziz, then the President of the GPYW.

At the first meeting of the I.S.S.F Executive Committee held in Riyadh following the OIC Summit, Prince Faisal announced a decision to establish the I.S.S.F headquarters in the Olympic Complex in Riyadh and allocate an annual subsidy from Saudi Arabia for the Federation's activities in addition to the annual subscriptions from Member NOCs.

At the 2nd I.S.S.F General Assembly Meeting held in Riyadh in 2000, HRH Prince Sultan Fahd Abdulaziz, President of Saudi Arabia's Youth Welfare and NOC, was elected I.S.S.F President. His election gave a great boost to the I.S.S.F activities, the most important of which was the 1st Islamic Solidarity Games. HRH was re-elected as I.S.S.F President for 2005-2009.

At the 7th I.S.S.F General Assembly Meeting held in 2011, HRH Prince Nawaf Faisal Fahd Abdulaziz, new President of Saudi Arabia's Youth Welfare and NOC, was unanimously elected I.S.S.F President. He outlined the future policy of the I.S.S.F to stress the importance of solidarity in serving the interests of youth and sports in member countries.



CHAPTER ONE

Organization of Games

Article (1): Date and Duration

The 5th Islamic Solidarity Games (ISG) will be organized under the supervision of the Islamic Solidarity Sports Federation (I.S.S.F) between 09–18 August 2022 in the Republic of Türkiye.

Article (2): Participants

- 2.1 Athletes from the I.S.S.F Member National Olympic Committees (NOCs) with National Federations recognized by the respective International Sports Federations (IFs) are eligible to participate in the 5th Islamic Solidarity Games.
- 2.2 Athletes must hold the nationality of the country they represent in accordance with Article (3) of these General Regulations.
- 2.3 Individual passports will be the only official ID documents of the athletes.

 Group passports will not be accepted under any circumstances.

Article (3): Athletes' Eligibility, Nationality and Age

3.1 Athletes' Eligibility

Athletes must hold the nationality of the country they represent. If they have acquired the nationality of a member country other than their own, they must complete three-year citizenship in the new country before the start of the ISG Games, submitting official documents to that effect.

3.2 Athletes' Nationality

- 3.2.1 Athletes in the ISG must be native of the country that registered them through its NOC.
- 3.2.2 An athlete who holds nationalities of two or more countries may represent one of them, as per his/her choice. However, after having represented one country in Olympic, Continental or Regional Games or any International or Regional Championships recognized by the respective International Federation, the athlete may not then, represent another country unless he/she meets the conditions

stipulated in Article 3.2.3, applied to the athletes changing their nationalities or acquiring new ones.

3.2.3 If any athlete represents a country in Olympic, Continental or Regional Games or any International or Regional Championships recognized by the respective International Federation and then changes nationality or acquires another one, he/she may only participate in the Islamic Solidarity Games representing the new country three years after the latest representation of his/her previous country.

This period can be reduced or even revoked with the approval of the two National Olympic Committees and the respective International Federation and endorsement by the I.S.S.F Executive Board, which considers each case individually.

- 3.2.4 If a country, a province or a colony acquires independence or merges with another country due to changing borders, or if a new NOC is recognized by the IOC, an athlete under such circumstances may continue representing the country he/she belongs to. However, if he/she prefers to represent the country in the ISG through his/her new Olympic committee, he/she has the right of choice only once.
- 3.2.5 The I.S.S.F Executive Board will decide on any related case that is not covered by this stipulation as well as all cases regarding the athlete's nationality, citizenship, residence and transition.

3.3 Athlete's Age

There is no age limit for athletes participating in the 5th Islamic Solidarity Games other than those prescribed for health reasons by the respective International Federation.

Article (4) Competitions Rules

- 4.1 The Turkish National Federation of each sport will be responsible for the preparation, administration and technical organization of matches and competitions under the supervision of the Technical Committee of each sport.
- 4.2 The competitions of the Games will be organized according to the rules and regulations of the respective International Federations, the ISG Basic Regulations and the General Regulations of these Games.

Article (5): Sports Program

5.1) The Games program will comprise 24 sports for men and women:

Article (6): Competition Format

6-1 Competitions or matches will not be held unless at least eight countries participate. In coordination with the ISG Organizing

- Committee, the Supervision & Coordination Committee may approve holding competitions that do not meet the said requirement, if deemed necessary for the success of the Games.
- 6-2 Individual competitions, in which one or more athletes represent the same country in each category, will be held if at least eight athletes from eight different countries take part. However, if fewer athletes arrive at the competition venue, the Supervision & Coordination Committee together with the Games Organizing Committee may approve holding competitions among five athletes from five countries as a minimum; otherwise, competitions may be organized among the athletes who have arrived but in such cases, no certificates or medals will be awarded to the athletes. New records, if any, will be registered.
- 6-3 In team sports, if some of the teams have apologized or failed to attend after the lot is drawn, due to any force majeure, the Supervision & Coordination Committee together with the Games Organizing Committee may hold competitions among five teams at least, otherwise, the competition will be held outside the Games. In such a case no certificates or medals will be awarded.

Article (7): Complaints, Protests and Appeals

- 7.1 Complaints against general and organizational matters must be submitted to the Games' Secretary General in written form, duly signed by the Chef-de-Mission or his appointed representative, to be decided by him. He may refer any such complaint to the Supervision & Coordination Committee for decision. In all cases, complaints must be decided within 24 hours.
- 7.2 Protests and appeals against competitions and/or results must be submitted in written form by the team official to the Technical

- Committee of each sport in due time, to be dealt with within 24 hours, taking into account the International Rules of the game, the ISG General Regulations and the Technical Handbook of the sport.
- 7.3 Appeals against athletes' eligibility must be submitted in written form duly signed by the Chef-de-Mission or the Team Official to the Athletes' Eligibility Committee, by attaching the relevant official documents validating the appeal before and during the Games. As for penalties, they must be applied in compliance with the laws of the International Federations.
- 7.4 Date and time of the appeal will be registered upon submission or receipt, endorsed by the signature of both recipient and applicant.
- 7.5 Whenever an appeal is submitted, a sum of US\$ 100, will be paid.
- 7.6 The above-mentioned fee is refundable if the appeal is upheld; otherwise it will become revenue for the I.S.S.F. These fees are paid against an official receipt issued by the Committee concerned.

Article (8): Penalties

- 8.1 The Technical Committee of each sport will impose penalties for any violation committed during the Games in conformity with the ISG Regulations and the International Rules of each sport. Penalties on athletes, coaches and officials will be determined according to the nature and degree of the offence.
- 8.2 The Referees' Committee in each sport will impose penalties on referees or judges according to the nature and degree of the offence.

Article (9): Doping Control Program

9.1 Every athlete is obliged to respond positively to the call of the Sports Medicine and Anti-Doping Committee whenever asked to conduct anti-doping tests. If any athlete objects or fails to respond to the

Committee's written notification of the time and place of collecting the samples, he/her will be excluded from the competition and his/her results will be nullified.

- 9.2 The I.S.S.F Sports Medicine and Anti-Doping Committee will be the sole authority responsible for the collection of the athletes' samples, their delivery to the accredited laboratory and the receipt of the results. The Committee Chairman will report the results promptly to the I.S.S.F Secretary-General.
- 9.3 In the case of positive results, the Games Secretary General will be informed thereof; the same will be announced by the Supervision & Coordination Committee in the presence of the Chairman of the Anti-Doping Committee. The Supervision & Coordination Committee will send a written notification to the Chef-de-Mission of the concerned athlete delegation and will take the necessary measures nullifying his/her competition results, excluding him/her from the remaining competitions, and thus, restituting the awarded medals or certificates.
- 9.4 The defaulting athlete and the Chef-de-Mission may apply to the Sports Medicine and Anti-Doping Committee for "B" sample procedures.
- 9.5 The NF President, after consultation with the I.S.S.F concerned department, will inform the respective International Federation as well as the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) and the other concerned organizations of these positive cases.

CHAPTER TWO

Participation in the Games

Article (10): Entry Forms and Deadlines

10.1 The Games Organizing Committee will extend an official invitation to all the I.S.S.F Member National Olympic Committees, attached with the Initial Entry Form for Participation with Sports.

10.2 ENTRY FORMS AND DEADLINES

The following deadlines are to be observed:

10.2.1 December 31st 2021

Konya TISGOC will send the Estimated Team Size forms to member NOCs.

10.2.2 January 31st 2022

Deadline for returning the Estimated Team Size form. In this form, each NOC will determine the sports in which it will take part.

10.2.3 February 1st 2022

Konya TISGOC will send the Entry Forms by Number to member NOCs.

10.2.4 March 10th 2022

Deadline for returning the Entry Forms by Number. In this form, each NOC will determine the number of its participants in every sport. The Event Management system (EMS) will be opened on March 1st 2022. Entries will be made via EMS.

10.2.5 March 10th 2022

Konya TISGOC will send the Final Entry Forms by Name to member NOCs.

10.2.6 April 01st 2022

Deadline for returning the Final Entry Forms by Name. In this form, each NOC shall determine the names of members of the participating delegation.

10.3 NOCs may return all their entry forms by e-mail before the deadline; afterwards, the original forms must be received by the Games Organizing Committee within one week at the most.

10.4 Entry Forms shall be completed by typing, signed by NOC President or Secretary General and sealed. Where applicable, Entry Forms shall also be signed by either the President or Secretary General of the respective Sports Federation and sealed.

10.5 **Meetings**: (Reviewing the final entries in each competition – Chefs de Missions - Lot Drawing) :

10.5.1 June 2022:

The Supervision & Coordination Committee will meet with the Games Organizing Committee to review the final position of NOC participation. The decision to cancel competitions shall be made in cases where participation of teams or athletes does not reach the minimum required number. The concerned NOCs will be informed of the details of such cancellation.

10.5.2 June 2022

The Games Organizing Committee will invite NOCs for the Chefs-demission meeting, lot drawing for team sports and establish a competition timetable. The Games Organizing Committee shall provide for accommodation and local transport. Members of the Supervision & Coordination Committee will also attend this meeting.

Article (11): Responsibilities of the I.S.S.F

- 11.1 The I.S.S.F will undertake the following responsibilities:
- 11.1.1 Supervising the Games through its Executive Board which entrusts this responsibility to the Games Supervision & Coordination Committee assigned to follow up the Games operation and submit periodic reports thereupon.
- 11.1.2 Forming the following committees:
 - Supervision & Coordination Committee
 - Athletes' Eligibility Committee
 - Doping Control Committee
- 11.1.3 Paying inspection visits to the Games venues, conducting on-site tours on competition, training and accommodation installations and means of transport.

11.2 The I.S.S.F also approves the following:

- 11.2.1 The Games dates as proposed by the Organizing Committee.
- 11.2.2 The Games' logo as proposed by the Organizing Committee.
- 11.2.3 Samples of award medals and certificates as well as commemorative certificates and medals.
- 11.2.4 The sports events listed in the program.
- 11.2.5 The laboratory recommended by the Games Organizing Committee to conduct doping tests and the number of required samples.
- 11.2.6 Participation fees.
- 11.2.7 Associated culture and art programs proposed by the Organizing Committee.
- 11.2.8 Manuals of the Chef de Mission and entry forms.
- 11.2.9 Accreditation manual and categories.
- 11.2.10 Programs of the opening/closing and medal awarding ceremonies.
- 11.2.11 Final draft of the Games documentary book.

11.3 The I.S.S.F shall prepare the following in cooperation with the Organizing Committee,

- 11.3.1 Games General Regulations and Technical Handbooks of sports events listed in Games.
- 11.3.2 The general program, time schedules and competition and training venues tables.

Article (12): Responsibilities of the Games Organizing Committee

The Games Organizing Committee will:

- 12.1 Extend the official invitation to the I.S.S.F member national Olympic committees, one year and a half before the Games date, attached with the initial entry forms.
- 12.2 Send out the general regulations and the technical handbooks approved by the I.S.S.F, as well as different types of entry forms one year before the Games.
- 12.3 Contract a laboratory accredited approved by the World Anti-Dope Agency (WADA), to conduct doping tests. A copy of the contract will be sent to the I.S.S.F.

- 12.4 Take necessary measures to print and issue accreditation/identification cards to all participants, according to the categories approved by the I.S.S.F.
- 12.5 Provide facilities for visa issuance for participants.
- 12.6 Prepare the necessary competition and training venues according to international specifications and standards and inform participating National Olympic Committees of the list of equipment and apparatuses to be used in the Games as well as the types of tracks, courts and gyms according to the respective International Federations' rules.
- 12.7 Provide suitable accommodation in the vicinity of sports venues, provided that they are ready to accommodate the delegations 5 days before the start of the Games and two days after the closure.
- 12.8 Cater for the athletes' meals and deal with requests for meal boxes that will be ready 24 hours after a request by athletes and teams at the competition and training venues. Dining halls operation hours will be determined by the Organizing Committee, or as advised by the Supervision & Coordination Committee.
- 12.9 Provide medical care in residential, competition and training venues. The Games Organizing Committee will allocate a certain number of beds in some hospitals for emergency cases.
- 12.10 Provide local transportation for the participating delegations, guests and Representatives of International and Continental Federations, a sufficient number of guides to help them perform their functions during the Games period.
- 12.11 Maintain security and discipline for participating delegations and guests, from their arrival up to departure at the venues of accommodation, training and competition.
- 12.12 Set up the main and branch Media Centers in the host cities and provide media representatives who will be covering the Games' events, with the required facilities.
- 12.13 Coordinate the TV transmission of the Games events, in coordination with the concerned authorities in the participating countries.
- 12.14 Organize cultural, social and recreational activities for the participants.
- 12.15 Issue a daily newsletter covering Games events and results in Arabic, English and French.

- 12.16 Prepare winners' medals and certificates as well as the commemorative medals and participation certificates for all the participating athletes.
- 12.17 Provide appropriate accommodation for extra officials and technical staff as well as media representatives at reduced rates and notify the participating NOCs thereof.
- 12.18 Prepare A/V records for all events
- 12.19 Issue the Games commemorative stamps and coins
- 12.20 Submit a comprehensive report within no more than 60 days after the end of the Games to the I.S.S.F according to the provisions of article 7.2.8 of the ISG Basic Regulations.

Article (13): Responsibilities of the participating NOCs

Participating NOCs shall undertake the following tasks:

- 13.1 Return the various Entry Forms with sports and numbers on the deadlines specified in Article (10) of these regulations.
- 13.2 Pay the participation fees of their delegation members, amounting to **US \$ 50 person/day.** This fee is paid as a charge for accommodation, boarding and internal transport. It is calculated from the arrival day through the departure day.
- 13.3 The total amount will be paid by bank transfer to the Organizing Committee, 15 days before the start of the Games. Otherwise, payment will be made within 24 hours of the delegation's arrival in Türkiye.
- 13.4 Participating delegations can be refunded for the fees of some of their members in case they leave after completing their tasks before the end of the Games. Charges will be paid for the actual period of stay of the delegation members.
- 13.5 Cover the delegation's travel expenses from their countries to Türkiye and return.
- 13.6 The Organizing Committee has the right to suspend the participation of any delegation if fees are not paid.
- 13.7 On condition that any participating team has rendered an apology, failed to attend or declared withdrawal from any competition after lot drawing, the Games Organizing Committee may impose a fine ranging between US\$ 5,000 10,000 on the concerned team. Such penalty will be approved by the I.S.S.F.

Article (14): Financial Obligations

14.1 The I.S.S.F Obligations:

The I.S.S.F shall cover the travel costs for its Executive Board members and representatives in the following Committees:

- Games Supervision & Coordination Committee
- Athletes' Eligibility Committee
- Sports Medicine and Doping Control Committee
- The I.S.S.F Representatives of various committees of the Games

14.2 The Konya TISGOC Obligations:

- 14.2.1 The Games Organizing Committee will cover the accommodation and local transportation costs for the members mentioned in Article 14 -1 hereinabove before and during the Games.
- 14.2.2 The Games Organizing Committee will cover the travel tickets, accommodation, local transport costs and indemnities as specified by international rules for International and Continental Federation delegates, who participate in supervising and organizing the Games, as well as the referees assigned to take part in conducting the competitions.

As for the referees accompanying their delegations, the Games Organizing Committee will only cover their accommodation and local transportation costs if they take part in conducting the competitions as well as their indemnities as prescribed by the International Federations' Regulations.

Article (15) Accommodation

The accommodation service will accommodate all the athletes and team officials of the 5th Islamic Solidarity Games Konya 2021 for a period of **09-18 August 2022.** An additional pre-opening period of two weeks to enable NOC's Chefs De Mission to complete the administrative matters upon the Delegation Registration Meeting, which will be held before the arrival of their teams. The schedule for Delegation Registration Meeting will be announced later.

Athlete Village and Hotels will accommodate the athletes and teams' officials for the whole length of their stay (from two days before the opening ceremony until two days after the closing ceremony).

Article (16) Accreditation

16.1 Process

The organization of a great sports event, such as the Islamic Solidarity Games, necessitates strict access control to all official Konya TISGOC 2021 venues, zones, and areas. This will be achieved through ticket allocation to spectators and by accreditation to athletes and other games participants with respective official job functions.

Every approved responsible organization will complete the accreditation application process on behalf of its delegation, including the receipt and distribution of the appropriate accreditation cards to each participant in Konya.

All participants must be accurately registered and duly accredited through the Konya TISGOC 2021 accreditation process in order to take part in the 5th Islamic Solidarity Games Konya 2021.

16.2 Validation

Upon arrival in Konya, participants must present their passport, and National Identity Card (Turkish National) to the validation desk at the Konya TISGOC accreditation centre as specified in the Accreditation Manual.

Article (17) Transportation

A comprehensive transport system for athletes, team officials and technical officials will be available exclusively for the 5th Islamic Solidarity Games Konya 2021. This will include:

- Transfer International Airport to the accommodation
- regularly scheduled shuttle service from accommodation to official competition and training venues
- dedicated service to opening and closing ceremonies
- dedicated service to all official functions and/or meetings
- transfer from the accommodation to Airport

Buses will provide the following services.

 Transportation services for the sports delegation upon arrival and departure

- Providing shuttle bus for delegates to and from matches/training of hotel
- Special vehicles for NOCs
- Provision of Transport for the Opening Ceremony and Closing Ceremony
- Transport Provision for Special Events
- Provision of Transport for NOCs in attending a Special Event
- Transport Provision for Official activities
- Transport Provision for Technical Officials, VIPs and media.
- Provision of Transport for Konya TISGOC

Article (18) Uniforms

Konya TISGOC will provide all International Technical Officials/ Jury/ Referees (ITOs), National Technical Officials (NTOs) and Technical Delegates with appropriate attire and uniforms.

A sizing form will be sent in advance to all parties concerned. Forms must be returned and received before the given deadline to ensure availability.

Article (19) Medical Services

A first aid and emergency first response medical service will be provided during the 5th Islamic Solidarity Games Konya 2021 to any person requiring medical assistance. This service will operate in the official 5th Islamic Solidarity Games Konya 2021 competition and training venues during official operating hours. This service will comprise a dedicated medical team supported by an ambulance service.

Article (20) Sports Information Center

One main sports information center will be located inside the Accommodations and a sports information desk will be located in each of the competition venues.

Article (21): Quota of Delegation Members

21.1) National Olympic Committee (NOC)

Article (22): Media Representatives

- 22.1 NOCs will pay for the participation fees of their media personnel as stipulated in article (13) according to the quota of Article (21.2).
- 22.2 Other Mass media including newspapers, magazines, radios and satellite channels can submit their applications for the Games' coverage to the Games Organizing Committee through the Media Entry Forms, provided that they cover their own delegations expenses, whereas the Games Organizing Committee will cover the costs of their local transport according to its regulations.

22.3 Media Entry Forms

- 22.3.1 NOCs shall endorse the completed Media Entry forms, approved by the respective Media Authorities, then, they shall be sent to the Organizing Committee.
- 22.3.2 The Games Organizing Committee will send the media entry forms to extra Mass Media Representatives wishing to cover the Games' events, provided that the forms are completed and approved by their organizations and returned to the Games Organizing Committee for approval before the deadline.

Article (23): Sport Attaché

Each NOC will appoint a Sport Attaché chosen from the staff of its country's Embassy or residents in Türkiye. He may hold the nationality of this country or another nationality. The Sport Attaché will be the link between the participating NOC and the Games Organizing Committee to follow up, facilitate and coordinate the delegations' participation procedures before and during the Games. He will, furthermore, attend the meetings of Sports Attachés held by the Organizing Committee.

If any National Olympic Committee is unable to choose a Sport Attaché, it will seek the assistance of the Games Organizing Committee to choose a volunteer willing to undertake the task with the approval of the NOC concerned. The Sport Attaché's work will be voluntarily and he will be issued an accreditation card from the Games Organizing Committee in order to facilitate his task before and during the Games.

CHAPTER THREE

Games Committees

Article (24): The Games Supervision & Coordination Committee

24.1 Composition

The I.S.S.F will form the Supervision & Coordination Committee within one year after the date of the allotment of the Games.

The Committee will be formed as follows:

24.2 Responsibilities:

- 24.2.1 Supervising the plans of action and the program of events and competitions.
- 24.2.2 Presenting all the necessary recommendations to the Organizing Committee to ensure a successful organization of the Games.
- 24.2.3 Examining the complaints referred by the different sub-committees.
- 24.2.4 Announcing the results of doping control tests carried out during the Games.
- 24.2.5 Submitting periodic reports on all Games-related issues to be the I.S.S.F. Executive Board meetings.
- 24.2.6 Setting the I.S.G General Rules, the Technical Handbooks of each sport and the schedule of events, in coordination with the Organizing Committee.
- 24.3 The Committee will be deemed in session throughout the Games duration in order to take the proper decisions concerning the changes in the

program and to deal immediately with any urgent matter or infringement of the International Rules and Regulations.

Article (25): Athletes' Eligibility Committee

25.1 Composition

The I.S.S.F will form the Athletes' Eligibility Committee before the start of the Games, as follows:

25.2 Responsibilities:

- 25.2.1 Examining protests regarding athletes' eligibility and nationality through the documents presented before and during the Games.
- 25.2.2 Taking action on appeals regarding athlete eligibility. Supporting documents will be attached therewith.
- 25.2.3 Reverting to the Supervision & Coordination Committee in cases of dispute over undecided matters. In this case, the Supervision & Coordination Committee decision will be irrevocable and binding.
- 25.2.4 Appeals against athletes' eligibility shall be submitted in written form duly signed by the Chef-de-Mission or the Team Official to the Athletes' Eligibility Committee, attaching the relevant official documents validating the appeal. Appeals may be submitted during the Games.
- 25.2.5 When deciding on appeals regarding eligibility, the committee will refer to Article (15) of the Games' basic Regulations and Article (3) of these General Regulations.
- 25.2.6 The Committee is entitled to verify all and any required documents such as passports, entry forms, etc. A committee member can be empowered to do so and report to the Committee.

Article (26): Doping Control Committee

- **26.1 Composition:** The I.S.S.F will form this committee as follows:
 - Head of I.S.S.F Sports Medicine & Anti-Doping Committee Chairman
 - Member of I.S.S.F Sports Medicine & Anti-Doping Committee Member

- Physician nominated by the Organizing Committee

26.2 Responsibilities:

- 26.2.1 Determining locations of equipped sampling stations in coordination with the Organizing Committee
- 26.2.2 Selecting a laboratory for the doping control program, in consultation with the Organizing Committee
- 26.2.3 Ensuring adequacy and sufficiency of bottles and equipment necessary for sample taking
- 26.2.4 Deciding on the number of required samples, in coordination with the Games Supervision & Coordination Committee as well as the Organizing Committee
- 26.2.5 Sending the written notifications to athletes required to undergo the tests and determining the place and time of sample collection.
- 26.2.6 Applying the necessary procedures of samples delivered to the laboratory, in coordination with the Organizing Committee
- 26.2.7 Proposing a written agreement to the Organizing Committee to firm up with the lab on the analysis of a fixed number of samples, the way of delivery and means and date of receiving results. This shall be carried out by fax, e-mail or hand-delivery, and the results will be sent to the I.S.S.F Anti-Doping Committee Chairman.
- 26.2.8 The Organizing Committee will appoint a group of physicians and specialists to assist the Doping Control Committee according to its demands.

Article (27) Sports Technical Committees

27.1 Composition

The Organizing Committee will form a Technical Committee for each sport before the beginning of ISG. The composition of that Committee will be as follows: - International Federation Delegate Chairman

- National Federation Representative Member & Reporter

- Three experts from the participating countries Members

27.2 Responsibilities:

- 27.2.1 Supervising and following up the technical matters, and competitions and submitting periodic reports to the Organizing Committee, which may refer them to the Supervision & Coordination Committee if necessary.
- 27.2.2 Endorsing competition results according to the reports submitted by the Referees Committee.
- 27.2.3 Examining the submitted appeals according to the Rules of the International Federation of the sport
- 27.2.4 Applying sanctions on athletes, coaches and officials
- 27.2.5 Proposing modifications to the date and venue of events and competitions in case of emergency
- **27.3** Technical delegates and team managers will meet at the invitation of the technical delegate of the respective sport.

Article (28) Referees and Judges Committees

28.1 Composition

The Organizing Committee will form a Referees and Judges Committee for each sport before the start of ISG. The composition of that Committee will be as follows:

- IF Technical delegate Chairman

- NF Representative Member/Reporter

- Three experts from the participating countries Members

28.2 Responsibilities

- 28.2.1 Applying penalties to referees and judges when necessary
- 28.2.2 Holding meetings for referees and judges before the start of the Games to consider judging-related matters, and holding any other meetings when necessary.

Article (29): Medical Committee

29.1 Composition:

29.1.1 The Organizing Committee shall form a medical committee consisting of a

- Chairman, a Deputy Chairman, three Members and a reporter.
- 29.1.2 Physician appointed by the I.S.S.F Sports Medicine & Anti-Doping Committee.
- 29.1.3 The Organizing Committee may constitute sub-committees for medical supervision if necessary.

29.2 Responsibilities:

- 29.2.1 Providing medical services in accommodation, training and competition venues.
- 29.2.2 Providing medical care for participants on referral
- 29.2.3 Reserving the required number of beds in hospitals in emergency cases
- 29.2.4 Conducting hygienic supervision at all utilities and dining halls.
- 29.2.5 Proposing the menus for participants' meal

Article (30): Media Committee

30.1 Composition:

30.1.1 The Organizing Committee will form a media committee consisting of a Chairman, Deputy Chairman, three Members and a reporter.

30.2 Responsibilities:

- 30.2.1 Proposing a complete project on the main press center, media centers, venues and equipment and supervising their operations.
- 30.2.2 Publishing newsletters and promotional publicity on the Games and distributing them to member countries and international media.
- 30.2.3 Publishing daily news bulletin on the competitions and events.
- 30.2.4 Developing the media transportation system to connect all venues.
- 30.2.5 Supervising press conferences on the related events for the Organizing Committee and media agencies.
- 30.2.6 Supervising press conferences on results and competitions.

Article (31) Committees' Meetings

The meetings of the committees specified in these regulations will be held according to the following:

- 31.1 The meeting will be held upon a call from the Committee Chairman. The Committee Reporter will take the required measures to convene the meeting and set the appropriate date and venue.
- 31.2 At its first meeting, the committee will elect a Vice-Chairman, who shall assume the responsibilities of the Chairman in case of his absence.
- 31.3 The validity of the committee meeting will be determined by the attendance of an absolute majority of members.

31.4	Decisions will be taken by the vote majority of present members.

CHAPTER FOUR

Medals, Certificates and Award Ceremony Protocols – Opening/Closing Ceremonies – Games Flag

Article (32) Medals, Certificates and Award Ceremony

32.1 The Organizing Committee will bear the expenses of manufacturing:

- The medals for winners in all competitions according to the rules of the sport.
- Ranking certificates for the winners of the 1st to the 8th places in all individual and team sports.
- Commemorative medals and certificates for all the guests, heads of delegations, referees, judges, coaches, officials, athletes, medics, mass media and all those who contributed to organizing the Games. Medals and certificates will be prepared in consultation with the I.S.S.F.

32.2 Award Ceremony

A joint committee from the I.S.S.F and the Organizing Committee will determine the people entitled to crown the winners and award medals and certificates. This will be arranged according to a timetable specifying the name of the person, the competition and the crowning time. The Games Protocol Committee supervising the award ceremony in every venue will be informed of the name and title of that person.

32.3 Medal Awarding

- Medals will be awarded to the winning athletes and teams immediately after every event final. The crowned athletes must wear sports clothing or the official uniform of their respective National Olympic Committees. The athletes ranked in the first three places will stand on the podium in front of the main stand where the 1st winner stands on a step slightly higher than the 2nd winner to his right and the 3rd winner to his left.
- Flags of the countries of the three winners will be raised while playing the national anthem of the first-place country only.

- Awards:

- 1st place: a gold medal and certificate for the first-ranked athlete or team.
- 2nd place: a silver medal and certificate for the second-ranked athlete or team.
- 3rd place: a bronze medal and certificate for the third-ranked athlete or team.
- Ranking certificates will be issued for the athletes and teams placed from fourth place to eighth place.

Article (33) Protocols

- 33.1 The Organizing Committee will draw a detailed plan of the Opening and Closing ceremonies and submit it to the I.S.S.F for approval. The opening ceremony will be characterized by simplicity, not exceeding two hours including special shows if any.
- 33.2 A number of seats will be reserved in the stadium stands during the opening and closing ceremonies for athletes so that they are able to watch the competitions and cultural shows.

Article (34): The Opening Ceremony

- 34.1 The Secretary General of the Organization of Islamic Cooperation (OIC), the I.S.S.F President, and the President of the Organizing Committee will receive the Games Patron or his deputy as well as their guests and accompany them to the stadium principal stand where they will be seated, while the national anthem of Türkiye is played.
- 34.2 The participating delegations will make an entry parade into the main Stadium preceded by the logos and flags of the OIC, I.S.S.F and Games. Each delegation will march wearing the official uniform, carrying a banner showing the name of the country and the National flag held by a delegation member. Delegations will march according to the Arabic alphabetical order of country names, and the organizing country's delegation will march at the end of the parade.
- 34.3 The OIC Secretary General, I.S.S.F President and the Organizing Committee President will hoist the flags of the OIC, the I.S.S.F, the Organizing Country and the Games in the main stadium. These flags and those of the participating countries shall be hoisted in all competition venues throughout the Games. The Organizing Committee President and the I.S.S.F President will deliver the opening speeches. At the end of his speech, the I.S.S.F President will invite the patron to announce the inauguration of the Games.

34.4 Six persons carrying the Games' flag will enter the stadium and walk towards the principal stand. The I.S.S.F Secretary General and the Games Director will follow and hoist the flag. Flags of the OIC, the host country, the I.S.S.F and the participating countries will be hoisted before the Opening in the main stadium.

34.5 Oath

Upon the inauguration of the Games, an athlete will take the following oath on behalf of the participating athletes:

"I swear by Allah to take part in these Games, preserving Islamic brotherhood and fair play spirit, and abiding by the Games' Rules. Allah is witness to my statement".

Upon the inauguration of the Games, a referee shall take the following oath on behalf of the participating referees:

"I swear by Allah to take part in officiating these Games honestly and fairly according to International Rules of the sport. Allah is witness to my statement".

Article (35): The Closing Ceremony

The Closing Ceremony of the Games will be held after the final of the last competition or match, where the holders of the flags of OIC, the I.S.S.F and the Games will enter, followed by holders of the flags of participating countries altogether. Participants parade hand-in-hand without any alphabetical order. All the parading participants will gather in the middle of the main stadium, flags will be lowered, and the I.S.S.F President will hand over the Games' flag to the Chefde-Mission of the country selected to organize the next Games. He will announce the conclusion of the Games.

Article (36): The Games Flag

The I.S.S.F will keep the Games flag in case no country applies for hosting the next Games.

CHAPTER FIVE

General Provisions

Article (37) Sponsorship and Publicity

- 37.1 The host city may not organize any other championships, sports events or competitions during the Games period.
- 37.2 All the rights of sponsorship, advertisement, TV Broadcasting and any other related commercial rights are the property of the Islamic Solidarity Sports Federation in accordance with Article (41) of the I.S.S.F Statute and Article (26) of the ISG Regulations.
- 37.3 I.S.S.F may authorize the Organizing Committee to invest all the rights of sponsorship, advertisement, TV broadcasting and any other related commercial rights to the 5th ISG directly or through other parties. Provision of Article (24) of the Games Regulations will be observed.
- 37.4 The participating delegations will abide by the rules governing the placement of any commercial marks on the clothes, uniforms and equipment of their members apart from the manufacturing company trademark which must not take up more than 10% of the area of any sports equipment appearing only once with its size not exceeding 60 cm² under any circumstances.
- 37.5 The size of any advertisement will not exceed 12 cm² for T-shirts, shorts and sports jackets, and 6cm² for caps, helmets, gloves and shoes.
- 37.6 Delegations participating in the Games must observe the restrictions on advertising activities during the period of this sports event.
- 37.7 Advertising on participants' clothes might be allowed after reaching a written agreement between Organizing Committee or its authorized commercial partner and the authority responsible for the athletes on whose uniform the advertisement will be placed.
- 37.8 Any delegate, official or athlete who does not abide by the aforementioned rules will be suspended till his/her position is adjusted and gives up faulty clothes and equipment.
- 37.9 The Organizing Committee ensures removing all advertisements from all facilities and venues before the competition.
- 37.10 The Organizing Committee ensures that no other championships, sports events or competitions will be held in the cities hosting the competitions of the 5th ISG during the period of this event.
- 37.11 Other rules issued by a relevant IF, in this respect, will be respected.

Article (38): Games Documentary Book

- 38.1 The Organizing Committee will prepare a comprehensive documentary book, in the three I.S.S.F official languages, illustrated with photos and tables within one year after the Games' conclusion, according to the provisions of Article 21.15 of the ISG Basic Regulations. The book will include information about:
 - The Games Organization
 - The Organizing Committee, the sub-committees and responsibilities
 - Governmental sectors that are involved in the Games.
 - The Host City
 - Preparatory meetings and visits
 - The I.S.S.F
 - Events, programs and facilities
 - Participating countries and sports
 - Detailed results of all competitions and record numbers
 - Medals and certificates awarded
 - VIP, dignitaries and persons who attended
 - Details of accommodation and transportation
 - International organizations involved
 - Details of Opening and Closing ceremonies
 - Accreditation and visas
 - Medical care and anti-doping program
 - Marketing and sponsorship
 - TV Broadcast, media centers and information technology.
 - Security services
 - Associated activities
- 38.2 The Documentary Book will be approved by the I.S.S.F before publication.

Article (39) Interpretation

The I.S.S.F, through its Executive Committee, will be the only reference for the interpretation of the regulations and rules of the 5th Islamic Solidarity Games.

It shall also take suitable action ,as necessary, on all the matters that are not stipulated in these Regulations. In case of any language dispute about the text of these Regulations, the Arabic version shall prevail.
