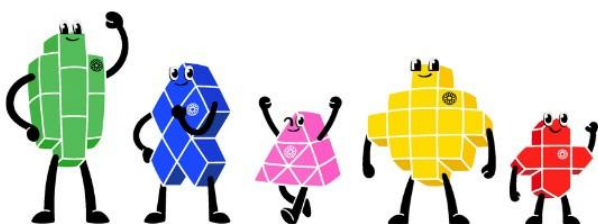

## 7. General Rules and Regulations

### 7.1 Rules

#### 7.1.1 Eligibility Code (OCA 52)

To be eligible for participation in the OCA Games, a competitor must:

- a) Observe and abide by the Rules of the IOC/OCA as per the Olympic Charter;
- b) Respect the spirit of fair play and non-violence and abide by the rules on the sports field;
- c) Comply with all aspects of WADA and OCA Anti-Doping Rules Code and refrain from using substances and drugs prohibited by the said organisations;
- d) The Member must ensure that any competitor in the OCA Games must be a national of the country of the NOC, which is entering him;
- e) Disputes relating to the determination of the country which a competitor may represent in the OCA Games shall be resolved by the EB, unless the eligibility code already set out in the Constitution



has been fulfilled and is not in dispute.

### **7.1.2 Nationality of Competitor (OCA By-Law52)**

- a) All cases of infringement of IOC Rule 41, 42 and it's Bye-laws and of the eligibility code of IFs shall be communicated by the concerned Member to the OCA, to be considered by the EB whose decision will be final;
- b) A competitor who is a national of two (2) or more countries at the same time may represent either one (1) of them, as he may elect. However, after having represented one country in the Olympic, Asian continental regional or world championships recognised by the relevant IF, the competitor may not represent another country unless he or she meets the conditions set forth in sub section 4 below that apply to the persons who has changed his nationality or acquired a new nationality;
- c) A competitor who has represented one country in the Olympic Games, OCA Games, continental, regional, and world championships recognised by the relevant IF, and who has changed his nationality or acquired a new nationality, shall not participate in the OCA Games to represent his new country until three years after such change or acquisition;
- d) If a State, Country or a colony acquires independence, a country becomes incorporated within another country by a change of border or transfer of sovereignty or if a new NOC is recognised by the OCA, a competitor may continue to represent the country to which he belongs or belonged. However, he may, if preferred, choose to represent his country or be entered in the OCA Games by his new NOC if one exists. This option can only be made once and is irreversible;
- e) In all cases not expressly addressed in these Bye-Laws, in particular those cases where a competitor would be in a position to represent a country other than that of which he is a national, or to have choice as to the country which he intends to represent, the EB makes all decisions. Decisions can be of a general The OCA Games 80 SEP 2017 or individual nature and issue specific requirements relating to nationality, citizenship, domicile or residence of the competitors, including the duration of any waiting period;

- f) Except as permitted by the EB, no competitor, coach or official who participates in the OCA Games may allow his person, name and picture or sports performances to be used for advertising purposes during the OCA Games.

### **7.1.3 Number of Entries (OCA 58)**

- a) For a sport to be included in the OCA Games programme a minimum of six (6) NOCs should enter their athletes by number and a minimum of four (4) should be physically present before the start of the competition;
- b) The maximum number of entries from each country in each sport or event is established by the Council in consultation with the member hosting the games and in accordance with the International/Asian Federation's technical rules;
- c) However, the following numbers cannot be exceeded;
  - For individual events, two competitors from each member;
  - For team events, one team per member, the number of competitors and reserves not to exceed the number allowed by the International/Asian Sports Federation concerned;
  - For events where individual and team competitions are conducted simultaneously, and the team event is decided by the aggregate score/time of each individual member of the team, the athlete (if maximum two) participating in the individual event must be designated as such in the entry form and only the athlete concerned will be competing in the individual event. This restriction overrides any regulations of the International/Asian Sports Federation concerned.

### **7.1.5 Technical Official and Jury of Appeal (OCA 59)**

The SEAGOC must not receive or otherwise give official recognition to any foreign political delegation or leaders of any other mission whatsoever, without the prior written approval of the OCA. However, nobody can be discriminated against if he or she is a duly

appointed official of the NOC's sports delegation.

#### **7.1 6 Court of Appeal (OCA 79)**

- a) The OCA EB on behalf of the OCA is the final Court of Appeal, which will decide all disputes of a non-technical nature concerning the OCA Games. Teams/Member NOC's, if necessary, may submit disputes to the Court of Appeal. In addition, the Court of Appeal may intervene in all disputes of a nontechnical nature outside the jurisdiction of the Juries of Appeal set up for each sport in the programme;
- b) The Court of Arbitration for Sport (CAS) in association with the OCA will set up a small Ad Hoc working group from CAS that will be present and working alongside the OCA in the SEAGOC period only, on the same lines as done during the Olympic Games. The participating athletes can address any issues that they may have directly with CAS, during the OCA Games.

#### **7.1.7 Claims of Protest (OCA 80)**

- a) Claims made to the judges on grounds concerning matters of fact are decided by them without appeal;
- b) Appeals against other decisions of the Judges or with regard to any other matters must be addressed to the President of the Technical Jury of Appeal for the sport concerned by a representative of the team making the appeal;
- c) Exceptional circumstances apart, a claim must be made within two hours of the decision giving rise to it. The Jury, after an investigation, shall give a decision and this decision shall be irrevocable, except in the case of disqualification of a team or of a competitor for infraction of the Rules and Regulations of the OCA. In these cases, it shall be decided by the Court of Appeal;
- d) All claims and appeals must be made in writing.

#### **7.1.8 Penalties in Case of Fraud (OCA 81)**

A competitor proved to have transgressed by fraud the Rules of the OCA shall be disqualified and lose any position he or she may have gained. If this competitor's team is proved to have been party to the fraud, his/her team shall be disqualified in the sport involved.

### 8.2 Competitional Rules

#### Events

1. Singles
2. Doubles
3. Team of 4

#### 8.2.1 Singles

- Maximum four players per federation.
- Six games in one block across 12 lanes.
- Each game shall be played on a different pair of lanes.
- Quarter-finals, Top 8 in the final standing is qualified for the Quarter-finals. Position 1 meets position 8 over one game (Match 1), position 2 meets position 7 over one game (Match 2), position 3 meets position 6 over one game (Match 3) and position 4 meets position 5 over one game (Match 4).
- Semi-finals, the winner of Match 1 meets winner of Match 4 over one game. The winner of the Match 2 meets winner of Match 3 over one game.
- Finals, the winners of the two semi-finals will play one game to decide the Champions.
- The two losers in the Semi-finals will both be awarded Bronze medals

#### 8.2.2 Doubles

- Maximum two Doubles per federation.
- Six games in one block across 12 lanes.
- Each game shall be played on a different pair of lanes.
- Quarter-finals, Top 8 in the final standing is qualified for the Quarter-finals. Position 1 meets position 8 over one game (Match 1), position 2 meets position 7 over one game (Match 2), position 3 meets position 6 over one game (Match 3) and position 4 meets position 5 over one game (Match 4).
- Semi-finals, the winner of Match 1 meets winner of Match 4 over one game. The winner of the Match 2 meets winner of Match 3 over one game.

- Finals, the winners of the two semi-finals will play one game to decide the Champions.
- The two losers in the Semi-finals will both be awarded Bronze medals
- Line-up changes are permitted only after the 6 games in the Quarter-finals, Semi-finals and the Final.
- Change of players is not permitted at any time during the Doubles event.

### **8.2.3 Team of 4**

- One team per federation.
- Six games in two three-game blocks.
- Semi-finals Top 4 team in the final standing is qualified for Semi-finals, where team position 1 meets the team position 4 and team position 2 meets team position 3.
- Finals, the winners of the two Semi-finals will play one game to decide the Champion.
- The two losers in the Semi-finals will both be awarded Bronze medals.
- Line-up changes are permitted only after the 6 games in the Semi-finals and the Finals.
- Change of players is not permitted at any time during the Team of 4 event.

## **8.3 Protest**

- 8.3.1 Claims made to the judges on grounds concerning matters of fact are decided by them without appeal;
- 8.3.2 Appeals against other decisions of the judges or with regard to any other matters must be addressed to the President of the Technical Jury of Appeal for the sport concerned by a representative of the team making the appeal;
- 8.3.3 Exceptional circumstances apart, a claim must be made within two hours of the decision giving rise to it. The Jury, after an investigation, shall give a decision and this decision shall be irrevocable, except in the case of disqualification of a team or of a competitor for infraction of the SEAGF Charter and Rules. In these cases, it shall be decided by the Court of Appeal;
- 8.3.4 All claims and appeals must be made in writing.

## **8.4 Uniforms**

Clothing worn by athletes and other relevant participants in competition must comply with the rules and regulations of OCA and the Asian Bowling Federation in force. Neither athletes nor technical official can attach any form of commercial advertising to his or her competition uniform without prior agreement with OCA and SEAGF EC.

## 8.6 Prizes and Commendations

8.6.1 Medals to the winners of the OCA Games shall be presented by the OCA President. The President may delegate this privilege to other members of the OCA, accompanied by the President of the IF and/or AF concerned (or their deputy), if possible, immediately after the event and where the competition took place in the following manner.

8.6.2 The competitors who have been judged first, second and third shall take their

places, in their sports uniforms, on a stand on the field facing the Tribune of Honour, with the winner slightly above the second who is on their right and the third who is on their left. The flag of the delegates of the winner shall be hoisted on the central flag-pole and those of the second and third on adjoining flagpoles on the right and on the left, as they face the arena. Meanwhile, the abbreviated National Anthem of the winner is played. The three winners/winning teams shall turn towards the flags.

8.6.3 The medal presentations shall be as per the following order:

- Gold Medal – to the first-place winner.
- Silver Medal – to the second-place winner.
- Bronze Medal – to the third-place winner.

Two third places will be awarded with bronze medals.

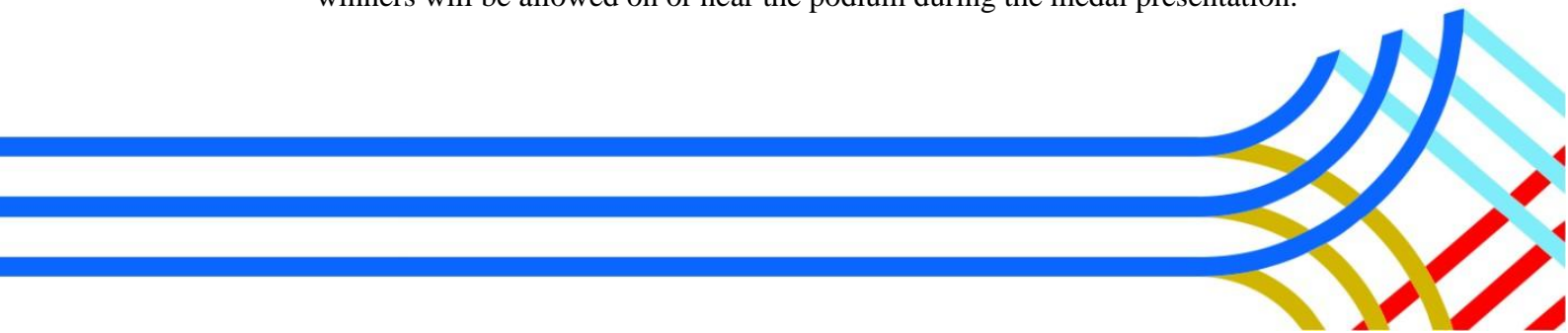
8.7 No equipment or accessories may be taken by the athlete to the medal award ceremony or media interview areas, unless it is worn, e.g., shoes and clothing which must be in accordance with the OCA commercial guidelines.

8.8 No kind of demonstration or commercial, political, religious or racial propaganda is permitted during the Victory Ceremony of the Games. Any action of such kind will be subject to penalization by the Executive Board EB including disqualification, withdrawal of medals, certificates, accreditation, rankings and the like.

8.9 Any disrespect shown to the Games, Medals, Flags, Mascot or Certificates or any other material. by any athlete during the Victory Ceremony or during the Games will be subject to penalization by the EB, including but not limited to disqualification, withdrawal of medals, certificates, accreditation, rankings as decided by the EB.

8.10 Victory, medals and diploma certificates, shall be in strict compliance with the OCA Protocol Guidelines. The design and format of the medals and diplomas shall be submitted to the OCA for its approval.

8.11 No other official/delegate from the participating delegations, other than the medal winners will be allowed on or near the podium during the medal presentation.





## 9. Medical Code

- The Host NOC and Organizing Committee of the SEA Games will ensure the health of all athletes and other participants during the SEA Games.
- Anti-Doping Rule Violations as defined by the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) Code is forbidden.
- All competitors shall be subject, during the Games, to doping control initiated by the Federation at any time or place, carried out in conformity with the WADA Code and its respective International Standards, as elaborated in the SEA Games Anti-Doping Rules.
- Competitors in sports restricted to women must comply with the prescribed tests for disorders of sexual determination when so needed.
- Any competitor refusing to submit to doping control or who is found guilty of any Anti-Doping Rule violation shall be excluded from the SEA Games.
- The principles of exclusion for teams and individuals shall be in accordance with the WADA Code.
- A medal may be withdrawn by order of the Executive Committee or the Council on the recommendation of the Chairperson of the Anti-Doping Committee when an athlete is found guilty of a violation under the SEA Games Anti-Doping Rules and or the WADA Code.
- The Anti-Doping Committee shall manage and implement the doping test programme for the SEA Games to which it was appointed for in accordance with WADA requirements, and implement the SEA Games Anti-Doping Rules and WADA Code.
- The SEA Games Anti-Doping Rules and Regulations shall in no way affect further and or other sanctions by the relevant International Federation, WADA and or any other relevant national, regional, continental, international or world organizations or bodies.
- All competitors and officials are also subject to, and shall comply with the respective anti-gaming and manipulation, and harassment and abuse, and safeguarding rules, regulations, codes and guidelines of the respective Federation Member-NOC, IOC, OCA, SEAGF, the respective IF and or AF of the sport concerned.
  - a) Any competitor or team official refusing to submit thereto or found guilty of any violation or offence thereunder shall be excluded from the SEA GAMES.
  - b) A medal may be withdrawn by order of the Executive Committee or the Council on the recommendation of the Arbitration Panel when an athlete is found guilty of any violation or offence thereunder.”

## **10. Doping Control**

The 33<sup>rd</sup> SEA Games Thailand 2025 Organizing Committee, shall establish the SEAGF Anti-Doping Committee, which shall, under the guidance of the SEAGF and working with the SEAGF Office, be responsible for the Anti-Doping program for the 33<sup>rd</sup> SEA Games Thailand 2025. The Anti-Doping program will be run in accordance with the SEAGF Anti-Doping Rules and the WADA International Standard for Testing and Investigation. Sample analysis will be performed at a WADA-accredited laboratory or as otherwise approved by WADA. Both urine and blood tests will be conducted before and during the competition to ensure compliance.

Athletes requiring the use of a Prohibited Substance or Prohibited Method during the event must apply for a Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE) through the SEAGF Anti-Doping Committee by the specified deadline (TBC). If an athlete has already been granted a TUE by their National Anti-Doping Organization or International Federation, the SEAGF Anti-Doping Committee will recognize it.
