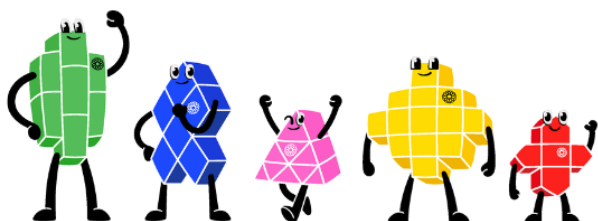

5. Entries

5.1 Eligibility

- 5.1.1 To be eligible for participation in the SEA Games, a competitor must comply with the SEA Games Federation (SEAGF) Charter and Rules as well as Rule 40 and the By-law to Rule 40 of the Olympic Charter (Participation in the Games).
- 5.1.2 Only nationals of the country of the NOC shall be qualified to represent the NOC in the Games. All disputes relating to the determination of the country, which an athlete may represent in the SEA Games shall be resolved in accordance with the South East Asian Games Federation (SEAGF) Charter and Rules as well as Rule 41 and By- law to Rule 41 of the Olympic Charter (Nationality of competitors).

5.2 Entry Policies

- 5.2.1 Each NOC may enter a maximum of three (3) athletes per event for individual events and only one (1) team for team events.



5.2.2 Mixed Team Events (10m Air Rifle Mixed Team Event, 10m Air Pistol Mixed Team Event): One (1) team per NOC is allowed in each event consisting of one (1) male and one (1) female.

5.2.3 Rifle events: Four (4) men and Seven (7) women

5.2.4 Pistol events: Seven (7) men and Seven (7) women

5.2.5 Maximal number of entries for each NOC: Eleven (11) men and Fourteen (14) women. Total Twenty-Five (25) athletes.

6. Eligibility

- 6.1 To be eligible for participation in the SEA Games, a competitor must comply with the SEA Games Federation (SEAGF) Charter and Rules as well as Rule 40 and the By-law to Rule 40 of the Olympic Charter (Participation in the Games).
- 6.2 Only nationals of the country of the NOC shall be qualified to represent the NOC in the Games. 9.3 Equipment at the Training Venue

- All athletes and teams are to provide their own equipment, including ammunition, for all training sessions.
- All firearms and ammunition must be kept at the armory in the competition venue. No person is permitted to bring out any firearm or ammunition from the competition venue.

10. COMPETITION PROCEDURES, RULES AND REGULATIONS

10.1 Competition Rules

The Shooting competition of the 33rd SEA Games Thailand 2025 will be held in accordance with the current International Shooting Sports Federation (ISSF) Rules and Regulations under the guidance of the Technical Delegate (TD) appointed by ASC/ISSF for ISSF events (Pistol and Rifle) In case of any disagreement in the language interpretation of the ISSF Rules and Regulations. The English version shall prevail. Any unforeseen cases not covered by the Rules and Regulations shall be resolve as follows:

- General Issues: To be resolved in accordance with the SEAGF Charter and Rules.
- Technical Issues: To be resolved in accordance with the ISSF Rules and Regulations and ISSF Norms.
- Team Events: ISSF Rules and Regulation Edition 2017, Second Print V1.2 01/2018
- The National Shooting Sport Association of Thailand (NSSAT) is responsible for and has full control of the technical organization of the 33rd SEA Games Shooting Competition, in consultation with the International Technical Delegate.

10.2 Official Draw

- The official draw for the Shooting competition shall be conducted in accordance with International Shooting Sports Federation (ISSF) Rules and Regulations at the Team Managers' Meeting, supervised by the Technical Delegate.
- The draw shall encompass start lists and lanes allocation for all the events in the schedule.
- The start lists will be made known to all team managers during the Team Managers' meeting.

10.3 Delays, postponements or cancellations

The Technical Delegate must consult the Thailand SEA Games Organizing Committee (THASOC) Secretariat if there is any delay, postponement or cancellation of any competition that affects the scheduled time for "live broadcast" or victory ceremonies

10.4 Sports Equipment

All sports equipment used by athletes in competition must comply with the SEAGF Charter and Rules and the International Shooting Sport Federation (ISSF) Rules and Regulations.

Equipment checks shall be conducted in accordance with the ISSF Rule Book. Failure to meet any specification could lead to the athlete being disqualified from the competition.

10.5 Competition Attire

All attire worn by athletes in competition must comply with the SEAGF Charter and Rules and (ISSF) Rules and Regulations.

10.6 Customs Clearance for Controlled, Prohibited or Restricted Items

Participating NOCs must take note of the following paragraphs on the general customs clearance policies in the Thailand, in particular, if some items of their sport equipment are listed as prohibited or restricted items:

Declare verbally to the immigration officers any prohibited or restricted item(s) that you are carrying.

Produce the prohibited or controlled items together with the import permit, if any.

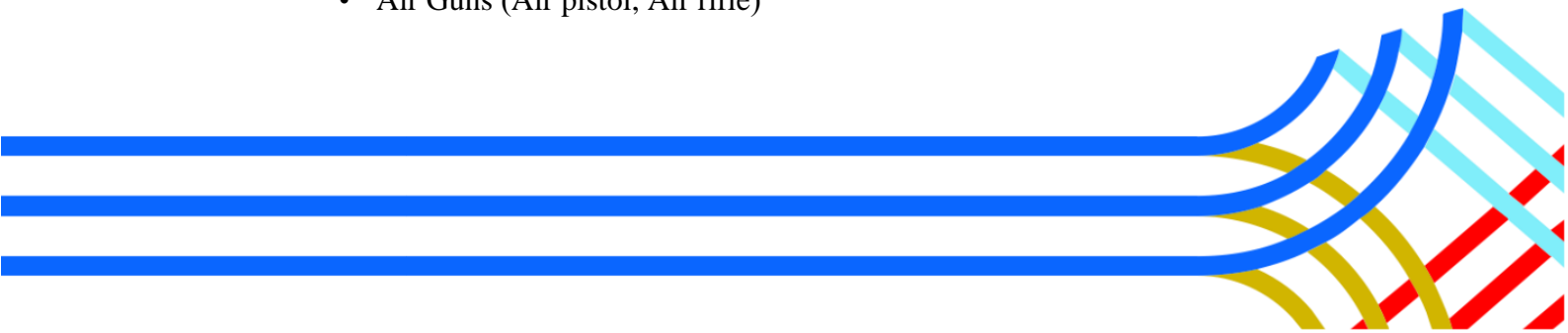
Identify oneself as a participant of the 33rd SEA Games competition.

Firearms with wrong serial numbers and those not in the submitted in the Firearms Form will be detained by the authorities.

10.7 Regulation of Sport Equipment

Participating NOCs must take note that the following types of sporting equipment are regulated under the Firearms and Explosive Act of Thailand which requires licenses

- Firearms
- Ammunitions
- Air Guns (Air pistol, Air rifle)



10.8 Firearms and Ammunition Import and Export of Firearms

The following work procedure will be adopted for import/export of firearms for the 33rd SEA Games 2025 Shooting competition:

- i Thailand SEA Games OC (THASOC) will consolidate list of participants and their sports equipment (sorted by country and category of equipment).
- ii Thailand SEA Games OC (THASOC) submits list and applies for approval to import/export firearms/ammo (at least forty-five (45) working days before arrival date
- iii The Thailand National Police will process request and will issue the approval to import/export to Thailand SEA Games OC (THASOC)
- iv Thailand SEA Games OC (THASOC) will send the approval import/export to the various NOCs prior to arrival.

10.9 Firearms, Ammunition and Air Guns

- i The following work procedure will be adopted for clearance of firearms, ammunitions and air guns for the 33rd SEA Games 2025 Shooting Competition.
- ii For firearms, ammunitions and air guns, armed escort will be required.
- iii Thailand SEA Games OC (THASOC) will make arrangements for the Thailand Airport Police to pick up the firearms and ammunition from aircraft.
- iv Thailand SEA Games OC (THASOC) Representative will meet up with the Thailand Police Officers at the arrival belt area and then proceed to Baggage Officer at arrival hall for declaration.
- v Customs Department will clear arms (by confirming with the import license/approval letter issued).
- vi Once cleared, Thailand SEA Games OC (THASOC) and Thailand Police will escort the arms to the approved place of storage.
- vii All participating teams must declare all of the firearms which will be brought into Thailand in advance. They are kindly requested to complete the firearms form and return it sixty (60) days before their arrival time to the Organizing Committee. The firearms will be stored at the armory in the competition venue at The National Shooting Sport Association of Thailand (NSSAT) Shooting Range.
- viii All athletes are advised to pack their air firearms and pellets separately from the small bore/shotgun firearms and ammunitions. All participants are also advised to store each of their firearms individually in a case or a bag.
- ix The number of firearms, their serial numbers and ammunitions with caliber must be stated clearly and correctly (e.g., 0.177 air pellets and 0.22 rounds) in the Firearms and Ammunition Form.
- x Firearms with wrong serial numbers and which are not in the submitted Form will be detained by the authorities.



11. GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS (SEAGF CHARTER AND RULES)

The 33rd SEA Games Shooting Competition will also be conducted in accordance with the SEAGF Charter and Rules which shall have precedence, including the following provisions:

11.1 SEAGF Article 30 – General Rules of the South east Asian Games

To be eligible for participation in the SEA Games, a competitor must comply with the SEA Games Federation Charter and Rules as well as Rule 40 and By-law to Rule 40 of the Olympic Charter (Participation in the Games).

11.2 SEAGF Article 31 – Nationality of Competitor

Only nationals of the country of the NOC shall be qualified to represent the NOC in the Games. All dispute relating to the determination of the country, which a competitor may represent in the SEA Games, shall be resolved by the Executive Committee in accordance with the By-law to Rule 41 of the Olympic Charter (Nationality of Competitors)

11.3 SEAGF Article 42 – Arbitration Panel

The council shall appoint an Arbitration Panel comprising such number as the Council may decide, of independent persons of good standing from amongst the South East Asian Countries to deliberate and decide finally on all questions concerning the Games or any claims, protest or appeals (including on any violation of anti-doping code, rules or regulations) from any sport under Sections 41 and 43 or any disputes arising from or related to the Games. NOCs or the Organizing Committee may submit questions to the Arbitration Panel. In addition, the Arbitration Panel may intervene in all questions of non-technical nature outside the Jurisdiction of the Jury of Appeal set up for each sport in the program of the Games.

11.4 SEAGF Article 43 – Claims, Protests and Appeals

Decisions made by the judges, referees and umpires on the competition field of play concerning matters of fact or judgement calls are final and no appeals are allowed. Appeals against other decisions of the judges, referees or umpires or regarding any other matter must be addressed to the Chairman of the Jury of Appeal for the sport concerned by a representative of the NOC of the country making the claim, protest or appeal.

Except in exceptional circumstances, any claim, protest or appeal must be made in writing within (sixty (60) minutes of the decision giving rise to claim, protest or appeal. The Jury of Appeal, after an investigation, shall then give a decision within two (2) hours of such claim, protest or appeal.

Any NOC dissatisfied with the decision of any Jury of Appeal may, within twenty four (24) hours of the notice of the decision of the Jury of Appeal, appeal in writing to the Arbitration Panel under Clause 42 which shall decide on the matter. All decisions of the Arbitration Panel shall be final.



11.5 SEAGF Article 44 – Penalties in Case of Fraud

A competitor proved to have fraudulently transgressed or breached any provisions of the Charter, Rules, Regulations or By-laws of the Federation shall be disqualified and lose any position or medal he/she may have gained. If this competitor's NOC is proved to have been a party to the fraud, his/her country shall be disqualified in the sport concerned.

12. TECHNICAL OFFICIALS AND JURY OF APPEAL

The appointments of Technical; Officials and Jury of Appeal members will be in accordance with Article 41 of the SEAGF Charter and Rules.

12.1 International Technical Officials (ITOs)

The Thailand SEA Games Organizing Committee (THASOC) shall propose one (1) Technical Delegate and the necessary number of International Technical Officials (ITOs) to the Asian Shooting Confederation (ASC) for approval.

12.2 National Technical Officials (NTOs)

The National Shooting Sport Association of Thailand (NSSAT) will appoint such number of National Technical Officials (NTOs) as may be approved by Thailand SEA Games Organizing Committee (THASOC) to assist the International Technical Officials.

12.3 Jury of Appeals

The Jury of Appeals shall comprise three (3) members proposed by the Thailand SEA Games Organizing Committee (THASOC) and approved by the ISSF/ASC.

13. PROTESTS AND APPEALS

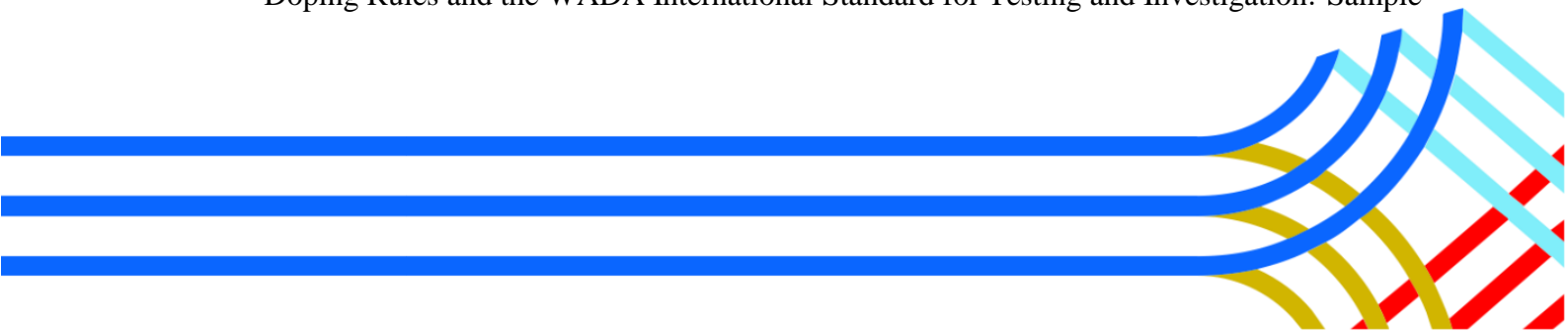
13.1 Any scoring protest or appeal must be made following the ISSF Rules and Regulations. All appeals related to the technical sides will be the responsibilities of the International and SEA Games Federations.

13.2 Any Athlete/NOC can appeal to CAS, in case he feels that there is violation of IF/AF Technical Rules or SEAGF Charter and Rules which is not related to reversing the decision of the referee or result.

13.3 The protest fee shall be refunded if the protest is upheld; it will be forfeited if the protest is rejected.

14. DOPING CONTROL

The 33rd SEA Games Thailand 2025 Organizing Committee, shall establish the SEAGF Anti-Doping Committee, which shall, under the guidance of the SEAGF and working with the SEAGF Office, be responsible for the Anti-Doping program for the 33rd SEA Games Thailand 2025. The Anti-Doping program will be run in accordance with the SEAGF Anti-Doping Rules and the WADA International Standard for Testing and Investigation. Sample



analysis will be performed at a WADA-accredited laboratory or as otherwise approved by WADA. Both urine and blood tests will be conducted before and during the competition to ensure compliance.

Athletes requiring the use of a Prohibited Substance or Prohibited Method during the event must apply for a Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE) through the SEAGF Anti-Doping Committee by the specified deadline (TBC). If an athlete has already been granted a TUE by their National Anti-Doping Organization or International Federation, the SEAGF Anti-Doping Committee will recognize it.

THASOC will establish the regulations and guidelines for the medal annual ceremonies and promptly communicate them to the organizers of each sport.

15. VICTORY CEREMONY

THASOC will establish the regulations and guidelines for the medal annual ceremonies and promptly communicate them to the organizers of each sport.

16. MEDIA INTERVIEW

16.1 All athletes should pass through the Mixed Zone.

16.2 Athletes and/or coaches should attend press conference and interview request for them.

17. Approval of the Technical Handbook

This Technical Handbook was approved by the South East Asian Aquatics (SEAA) on 30 June 2025.
